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Pastor

We all want to find God's best, be sure that what we believe is the truth, be convinced that what we do each day makes a difference in the world, and know how to live in a culture that is becoming more hostile towards God's moral laws. This sounds like a lot! Are we expecting too much? We remember Romans 12:1-2, where God tells us to present ourselves wholly to him as a spiritual act of worship. The idea of spiritual is "informed." We give ourselves to God when we understand who God is, what he has given us in the gospel, and what he demands from us. I do not think we are asking too much when we desire the above mentioned things.

I mention that because we started the year with a series called "Finding God's Best," which was a look at Romans 12-14. We will grow spiritually and find God's best when we offer our lives to God, when we understand ourselves and the gifts God gave us, when we truly love other believers, when we get the best of evil by doing good, when we live as a responsible citizen in our country, and when we remember that Jesus is coming back.

But with a minute - who is this God we follow? If we're not sure what we believe, we're not going to be very motivated to follow him. The next message series was called "This We Believe." We live in a pluralistic culture where there are many options before us, but Christianity is unique. Did you know that you could sum up the entire Bible in three words: Creation, Fall, and Redemption. God created a perfect world but something went drastically wrong, but God had a plan to rescue us through Jesus, and the resurrection is proof that God's plan worked. Part of his plan also includes local churches like us who seek to be a light in their community.

But wait a minute - this sounds so grand, but often times life is just plain boring. We go to work to get the money to buy the food to get the strength to go to work. Does God really care about our everyday lives? The next series was called "Your Work Matters." We were created to contribute and our work can be an act of worship to God and can be a witness for God. However, work is difficult because we do live in a broken world. However, one day Jesus will restore everything and then we will be able to work for the king in a perfect world.

But wait a minute - is this pie-in-the-sky kind of thinking? Can God really pull this off? The next series we did was on the book of Daniel. The same theme gets repeated over and over again, that God is absolutely sovereign over the kingdoms of this world and is bringing all things to completion for the display of his glory. In the meantime, life is hard and it may even get harder before it gets easier. Like Daniel, we must not succumb to cultural gods, but persist in prayer and in trusting God to work out his plan.

But wait a minute - what does that mean for us right now? It means that we give thanks to God for all the things that you will read about in this annual report at it looks back on the past year. It means that God has plans for his church here in Pleasantville. It means that God is inviting us to join with him in changing our neighbourhood one conversation at a time.
