Pastor

We can worry about the events in the world, feel anxiety in our lives, put our hope in the wrong places, fail to focus on the cross, and forget that God has written a story with a great future. I pray that the sermon series this past year has encouraged us in these areas.

GO YOUR WAY UNTIL THE END - First, we began with the book of Daniel, chapters 7-12. God has always been in control of human history, and history is a record of the ultimate spiritual battle between God and Satan. God's people do get caught in the crossfire, but are called by God to resist evil until Jesus returns and he restores what has been broken. We are to go our way until the end, be faithful and not give up or become weary in well-doing.

LET YOUR SOUL CRY OUT - Second, we dug into our emotional life as Christians. Emotions are the language of the soul. Anger, fear, envy, despair, contempt, and shame reveal how our hearts are doing with God and others. However, our emotions are tainted by sin, and need to be renewed through Jesus Christ. Our God is an emotional God, and it is through our emotions that we discover the mystery and goodness of God. God wants us to be passionate for his glory.

WORSHIP JESUS AS KING - Third, our country faced an election in 2019, so we investigated to see what the Bible says about faith and politics. No one can separate faith and politics. Both involve saying who is worthy to rule and judge. What we trust shows who our gods are. This is why politics reveals our worship. Our lives are political because we have to look at our relation to King Jesus and his claim on our lives. Our greatest need is to know that we need God.

PLEASE STAY ON THE PATH - Fourth, we examined the message from the first four chapters of 1 Corinthians. The cross of Jesus Christ must be the foundation and guide for all that we do in our personal lives and a church community. We must depend on the Holy Spirit, pursue unity, and understand the nature of Christian leadership. The cross looks like weakness and shame, but it was through the cross that God defeated evil and calls us to a relationship with himself.

EMBRACE THE TRUE STORY THAT EXPLAINS REALITY - Fifth, we found that Christianity is a worldview. Christianity is a true story of how the world began, how it will end, and everything important that happens in between. Our worldview impacts how we answer the big questions of life: Is there a God and what is he like? What is the meaning of life? Is there an afterlife? Every one answers based on their worldview. Our worldview must be shaped by the Bible.

JOSEPH (CHURCH) DID YOU KNOW? - The last message of the year was the story of Joseph, the adoptive father of Jesus. Joseph sacrificed his reputation to trust and obey God. God takes the shame of Joseph to bring hope and righteousness to the world. What are we willing to risk to follow God in the new year in reaching our neighbourhood one conversation at a time?
