"The Joy of Our Salvation" John 15:11; Romans 4:1-8; Romans 5:1-12

"If we were not allowed to speak of what we value and celebrate what we love and praise what we admire, our joy would not be full." (John Piper)

- What is Christian joy (contentment)? (Psalm 90:14)
 - Christian joy (contentment) is willful obedience (Philippians 4:9), emotional commitment (Philippians 4:6-7), and a growing knowledge of Jesus Christ (Philippians 4:8 & 11).
- What is the basis of my Christian joy (contentment)?
 - Jesus Christ and His work is the basis of my joy (Philippians 4:13). Everything I need to glorify
 God and be full of joy (content) is found in the riches of Jesus Christ (Philippians 4:19).
- What are specific things inside of the work of Christ (Hebrews 7:25) that should bring me joy (contentment)?
 - I should be full of joy because ALL my lawless deeds are forgiven, ALL my sins are covered, and NONE of my sins will be counted against me (Romans 4:7-8).
 - I should be full of joy because God counts righteousness apart from works. I don't get what I
 deserve. I receive as a gift the grace and mercy of God (Romans 4:3-6; Romans 5:6-7).
 - I should be full of joy because I'm justified, I'm at peace with God, I'm saved by faith, and I will be glorified, namely, all of my spiritual and physical defects removed by the power of Christ! (Romans 5:1-2 & 8-10).
 - I should be full of joy because godly suffering produces holiness. I should be full of joy because godly suffering strengthens my faith. I should be full of joy because the power of God is at work in my life through the Holy Spirit (Romans 4:20-21; Romans 5:3-5).
 - I should be full of joy because I have access to God. I have been reconciled to God. I get to know and enjoy God by the private and public means of grace (Romans 5:9-11).
