"Does the Spirit of God Dwell in You? Do You Belong to Christ?"

Romans 8:9-15

- God's love has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit (Romans 5:5). We were raised in Christ to walk in the newness of life (Romans 6:4). As we are walking in the newness of life we are bearing fruit for God by the power of the Holy Spirit (Romans 7:4 & 6). I can set my mind on the things above because I have been raised with Christ (Colossians 3:1-4). Therefore the Holy Spirit is the evidence that I am loved by God, no longer under condemnation, and that my sins are forgiven (Romans 8:1-4).
- (Romans 8:9-10) The Holy Spirit dwells inside of everyone who is in Christ (Romans 8:9; 1 Corinthians 6:11 & 19-20). But, how do I receive the Holy Spirit (Galatians 3:2-3; Acts 2:38-41; Ephesians 1:13-14)?
- (Romans 8:11) The Holy Spirit will give life to our mortal bodies....
 - We will have a resurrected body like Christ's (Romans 6:5).
 - Our mortal bodies will be swallowed up by life when we put on our heavenly dwelling, that is our resurrected bodies (2 Corinthians 5:1-5). The indwelling Holy Spirit is a guarantee of this.
 - Our earthly bodies will become imperishable and immortal giving us full victory over sin and death (1 Corinthians 15:49 & 53-57).
- Four Evidences of the Holy Spirit in Romans 8:5-16
 - The Holy Spirit gives us a mind that loves God, desires to submit to God, and desires to please God; life and peace (Romans 8:5-8).
 - The Holy Spirit gives us the desire to resist temptation and put our sin to death by humbly relying on the Spirit's power (Romans 8:12-13; James 4:7).
 - The Holy Spirit leads us by God's Word and we submit to God's Word by His power (Romans 8:14; Psalm 119:105).
 - The Holy Spirit gives us the ability to look to God for strength, protection, and provision; to have no fear (Romans 8:15; 1 John 4:17-18).
- The Role of the Holy Spirit in our lives....
 - He encourages us and exhorts us (John 14:16).
 - He gives us spiritual gifts (1 Corinthians 12:4-11).
 - He sanctifies us/produces fruit in our lives (Galatians 5:22-23).
 - He guides us in truth/to understand God's Word (John 16:13; 1 Corinthians 2:12-13).
 - He assists us in prayer and intercedes for us (Jude 1:20; Romans 8:26-27).
 - He seals us. He guards and guarantees our salvation (Ephesians 1:13-14; 4:30).
 - He gives us joy/contentment (1 Thessalonians 1:6).
