## "Is There Injustice on God's Part? Who Can Resist His Will?" (Part 3) Romans 9:19-24

- Romans 9:19-20: Humility and Worship
  - Our thinking is always inferior to God's thinking (Romans 11:33-34; 1 Corinthians 1:18-25).
    - Human wisdom, opinions, desires, and aspirations didn't help you get saved and they will not help you in salvation. We worship (our own) human education, philosophies, and opinions (Romans 1:21-25).
    - Even if God could possess any foolishness or weakness (which He does not), it would still be superior to the best that man could muster.
    - It is only through the wisdom of God that man can find salvation. They must humble themselves and admit they can't find salvation and peace apart from God's mercy and compassion.
  - Questioning God's goodness and His justice puts us in the place of supremacy and authority. Submitting to God and His wisdom exalts God and humbles us (James 4:6 & 10; 1 Peter 5:5-6; Psalm 142:1-7).
  - Pride says: "God, You are the beneficiary." Humility says: "I am the beneficiary." There is a great damage to be done in striving with God according to your own wisdom (Isaiah 45:9-12; Isaiah 64:8).
  - There is a great Biblical tension between God's sovereignty and man's responsibility that Paul does not answer, nor can it be answered (Isaiah 55:6-9).
- Romans 9:21-24: His Right and His Glory (Ezekiel 18:30-32; Ezekiel 33:10-11)
  - God has the right, from the same Nation (Romans 9:6), bloodline (Romans 9:7-8), womb (Romans 9:11-13), or lump of clay (Romans 9:21), to save some and not save others. God does everything He does for His glory and according to His purpose, wisdom, and justice.
  - An honourable vessel in a household had tremendous value (1 Peter 2:9-10). It was
    used as a vessel of service (Galatians 5:13), but it was also a vessel of great beauty, it
    brings praise to the potter (1 John 2:5-6). The beauty of God's grace takes what was
    dead and brings it to life (Ephesians 2:5; Philippians 3:7-8).
  - A dishonourable vessel was left in its natural state (Romans 3:10-18). It still had purpose, but was used for refuse and is left hidden or does not bring glory to the potter (Romans 1:18-25).
  - God is glorified in salvation and God is glorified in demonstrating His wrath and justice towards sin (Romans 2:5-8). God shows His power in the right to both save and to damn (Psalm 2:9-10; Matthew 10:28-31). God patiently endures His enemies calling them to repentance, despite their rebellion and disbelief (Romans 2:4-5).
  - His grace and our need of grace is demonstrated in both sinful and holy behavior. The sinner sinning shows our helpless estate and the saint living a holy life shows our dependence on His grace to glorify Him (Romans 3:19-20; Ephesians 2:8-10).
