## "Ecclesiology: The Doctrine of the Church: What is a Deacon?"

1 Timothy 3:8-13; Matthew 20:26-28; John 12:25-26; Acts 20:35; 2 Corinthians 9:10-12

- We have all been called to serve/be generous, *Deacons* have been called to be examples of servanthood/generosity.
  - Matthew 20:26-28: Greatness/contentment in Christianity is found in humble servanthood. We have been called to give or pour our lives out for the gospel (2 Corinthians 12:15).
  - John 12:25-26 & Acts 20:35: When we prefer our interests over the will of God we will lose eternal life. When we make Christ and His will our priority we will show we have eternal life. It is better to give than to receive in God's economy.
  - 2 Corinthians 9:10-12: Generosity in your resources leads to holiness and holiness leads to more generosity. Holiness and generosity leads to God being praised or glorified.
- Proper standards of holiness leads to proper governing of the church. (1 Timothy 3:8-13).
  - Personal qualifications:
    - *Dignified:* They are serious about God's work; they are worthy of respect.
    - *Not double-tongued:* They keep their word and they do not gossip.
    - *Not addicted to much wine:* They practice sobriety and self-control.
    - Not greedy for dishonest gain: They are responsible with or a good steward of their money.
  - Spiritual qualifications:
    - They must hold the mystery of the faith with a clear conscience: They live out their biblical convictions.
    - *They prove to be blameless:* Strive for holiness; morally excellent.
    - They are devoted and faithful to their spouse: They care for the spiritual condition of their spouse.
    - They manage their households: They practice personally what they will be practicing publicly in the church.
- General information about Deacons:
  - The word *Deacon* can be translated in multiple ways; as one who serves, as an administrator, or one who brings relief. But what we know for sure is that this office was given to the church to help people with their physical needs and serve the church by serving, hospitality, organizing, and welcoming.
  - The *Deacon* position also exists to assist the Elders in ministering to the people so that the Elders can focus on preaching/teaching, prayer, and developing leaders within the church (Acts 6:1-4; 2 Timothy 2:1-2; 1 Timothy 3:1-7; 2 Timothy 4:1-5).
  - The Elders are the teaching/preaching and governing office of the church (1 Timothy 2:12, 3:2, 5:17, Titus 1:9). This office is to be held by men and the office of Deacon can be held by men or women. Deacons are equally qualified with Elders in terms of character and spiritual life.
     Preaching/teaching and governance are the major distinctions.
- Deacons are called to be examples of the biblical work ethic:
  - We are called to be fellow workers with God (1 Corinthians 3:9; 1 Thessalonians 3:2; Colossians 4:11).
  - Hard work is holy and virtuous and slothfulness is a sinful vice (Proverbs 12:14; Proverbs 12:24;
     1 Corinthians 4:12; Ephesians 4:28).

 Idleness destroys the church (Proverbs 18:9; Proverbs 21:25; 1 Thessalonians 5:14; 2 Thessalonians 3:10-12).

"Failure to expend full effort in living for Christ can be justified in all kinds of ways, from self-care to self-love to a demonstration of the conviction that we're not saved by works — so we'll perform works sparingly and sporadically, since they aren't really required for salvation. This will never lead to a life of holiness or a life that pleases God. This is incredibly offensive and true (Colossians 1:10; Hebrews 13:20-21; 2 Corinthians 7:1)."
