"The Parable of the Log and the Speck" Matthew 7:1-6/ Luke 6:37-42

"Humble yourselves before the Lord, and He will exalt you. Do not speak evil against one another, brothers. The one who speaks against a brother or judges his brother, speaks evil against the law and judges the law. But if you judge the law, you are not a doer of the law but a judge. There is only one lawgiver and judge, He who is able to save and to destroy. But who are you to judge your neighbor?" (James 4:11-12)

- *"Judge not, that you be not judged."*
 - The Bible is clear that the Christian has been called to judge....
 - Sin within the church (Matthew 18:15-17; 1 Corinthians 5:1-12).
 - False Teaching (1 John 4:1-6) and False Teachers (Matthew 7:15-20).
 - Some disputes between brothers in Christ (1 Corinthians 6:5-6).
- "With the judgment and the measure you use...."
 - We want to avoid judgment without mercy (Luke 6:36; James 2:13; Matthew 5:7).
 - We want to avoid judgment with condemnation (Romans 8:1 & 34; John 3:18-19).
 - We want to avoid judgment without forgiveness (Matthew 6:14-15; Matthew 18:35).
 - We want to avoid judgment with self-righteousness/hypocrisy (Matthew 7:5; Romans 2:1; Luke 16:15).
 - Our judgments should be generous in love, gentleness, patience, grace, mercy, and forgiveness.
- "Why do you see the speck in your brother's eye but not the log in your own eye?"
 - Self-righteousness and callousness (unrepentance) to sin leads to being blind to our own sin and hyper-sensitive to or hyper-critical of the sins of others (2 Samuel 12:5-7).
 - We must deal with our own sin properly if we are going to be useful to our brothers and sisters in Christ in addressing their sins (Psalm 51:10-13).
 - All confrontation of sin in others must be done in humility and gentleness realizing that you are a fellow sinner/saint (Galatians 6:1-3).
 - Here are some heart conditions we must be aware of in our lives (Psalm 139:23-24):
 - When we regularly assume the worst of others and the best of ourselves.
 - When we are more bothered by others' sins than our own.
 - When we judge people by their worst moments and give no value to anything else.
 - When we try to judge the motives of why someone did something.
 - When we offer ourselves more grace and mercy than others.

"He who is not an enemy of his own sin will be an enemy to his brother. He who is an enemy to his own sin will be a great help to his brother." (Matthew Henry)

- "Do not give dogs what is holy and do not throw your pearls before pigs...."
 - A dog or a sow/pig is never a description of someone who is in Christ biblically (2 Peter 2:22; Proverbs 26:11).
 - People can reach a point when sharing biblical truths is no longer wise. They attack those who offer them something valuable (Acts 18:6). Something that is holy is set apart for God (1 Peter 1:15-16) and a pearl is the most valuable of the jewels (Matthew 13:45-46), they don't view the Scriptures in this way (2 Timothy 3:16-17).
